Brownstown Speedway Pit Rules

- 1. Track officials reserve the right to reject or allow the entry of any car or driver or any other person to the pit area or grounds.
- 2. ALL persons desiring to enter the pit area must sign a voluntary wavier & release from liability & indemnity form, and pay for and receive a pit pass.
- 3. In the event of a rain out, you must keep your pit pass; this will be your only allowed admittance in the event that the race is rescheduled. Your signature on pit sheets or Management "remembering you were there" will not gain you admission at any time.
- 4. Anyone in the pit area without an authorized pit pass will be asked to immediately leave the grounds. Management, officials, or security personnel reserve the right to ask for proof of admission at any time.
- 5. A car may compete in <u>only 1 division</u> per night. A driver may compete in more than 1 division providing the race program is not delayed (we will not wait for drivers to transfer from one car to another). Drivers must have arrangements for someone to have their cars in the line up shoot when called for. Drivers competing in more than 1 division must have a paid admission for each division they participate in.
- 6. Every driver must completely fill out a driver information form for tax purposes before you will be paid.
- 7. Money not collected on race night will become property of Brownstown Speedway. Pit office will close 30 minutes following the last event of the night.
- 8. Racecars are not allowed on any part of the grounds other than the pit area and track. DO NOT leave the pit area with your racecar. Racecars should maintain a reasonable speed (approximately 5-MPH) when traveling through the pit area. Anyone traveling with excess speed, cutting donuts, or using their car for any other inappropriate conduct will be disqualified for the night and forfeit all money, points, and admission charges. You may also face possible suspension.
- 9. Use of 4-wheelers, golf carts, etc.., (Hereafter referred to as 4-wheelers) will be allowed <u>only in the pit area</u> and <u>only for the purpose of assisting a race team</u> (hauling fuel, pushing cars etc...). No motorcycles, minibikes, or mopeds, bicycles etc... will be allowed. No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to operate a 4-wheeler in the pit area. Anyone driving a 4-wheeler must show a driver's license when asked by management, officials, or security. **4-wheelers should maintain a reasonable speed (approximately 5-MPH) when** traveling throughout the pit/track area. Anyone traveling with excess speed, cutting donuts, or using their 4-wheeler for any other inappropriate conduct will be asked to stop use for the event and/or possibly a longer time period determined by officials. Individual misconduct of 4-wheelers could result in a ban of ALL 4-wheelers for the remainder of the season.
- 10. All crew members must remain on the right side of the line-up shoot (on the grass hill side) while cars are in the line up shoot. No crew members are allowed on the racetrack at anytime. Anyone coming out on the track and approaching a car will result in that car being disqualified.
- 11. No communication devices (radios) are allowed between drivers and crew members. Anyone caught sticking their arms, flashlights, sticks or other communication devices through the backstretch fence or any fence will result in that car being disqualified. Nothing with lights (ex. lighted sticks, flashlights, flashing items, etc.) will be allowed to communicate with the driver.
- 12. NO INTOXICATING BEVERAGES, NARCOTICS, or ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES are to be consumed or in use by anyone holding an authorized pit pass. No firearms, explosives, or other potentially dangerous weapons will be allowed on the fairgrounds. Violations will result in immediate ejection from the grounds and/or suspension and/or arrest.
- 13. No Animals allowed except for Service Animals
